JUNE/JULY 2ND SUNDAY DEMOS:

June: Robert Richardson: "How best to use your photographs to make a painting", Sun, June 10, 1:30-3:30pm Robert is best known for paintings that are rich with color, space, light, and bold lines. The Amesbury resident teaches oil painting classes designed to help the serious beginner get started or for those artists looking for a new direction and approach to their art. He will cover techniques and tricks to search out vital aspects of your photograph[s] that can lend themselves to creating to a balanced compositional sketch suitable for making a painting. His methods can be a useful tool for any artist and any medium. This program is timed to coincide with the gallery's June "Eye of the Beholder" show in which a photographer and a painting the photographer recreates or interprets.

July: Natasha Stoppel: "Social Media Marketing for Artists" Sun, July 15, 1:30-3:30pm. In the ever-evolving world of social media it can be daunting to understand what resources are available to market your artwork and how to use them to directly translate into sales. Natasha Stoppel will focus on six different social media platforms and how you can use them to market your work, plus other ways to use social media beyond the apps themselves: Facebook, Instagram and Pinterest, also Twitter, Youtube, and Etsy as additional options.



Natasha has been exploring the world one drawing at a time ever since quitting her corporate job in 2014. She launched her blog Artist Explores the World in 2013 and has turned it into a marketable business with the use of social media. In 2017 Natasha started working with other people to develop their social media presence, and she has worked with local businesses in the Exeter area as a social media adviser and assistant. She currently works for Exeter TV and has a studio space at Art Up Front Street and an artisan shop space at the Seacoast Artist Association Gallery.

JUNE 2018 FEATURED ARTIST: NATASHA STOPPEL

Exhibit: June, 2018 at Seacoast Artist Association gallery. Reception Friday, June 1, 4-7pm

Stoppel will be displaying works in a variety of mediums. Work will feature trips to Japan and Mongolia including: watercolor, photography, pyrography, video and laser cut wood. At the opening reception there will also be a sampling of videography and animation work. Jewelry will also be available each with its own unique travel story. Refreshments will be served.

"Realities Imagined" examines the process of turning real travel experiences into works of imagined art. Stoppel is a traveling artist exploring the world one drawing at a time. After leaving her corporate job in 2014 she launched Artist Explores the World, a blog and Youtube channel designed to feature art and travel. Since then she has trailblazed a creative path into bullet journaling, videography, animation, jewelry making and now pyrography. When not solo backpacking, she's focused on turning her experiences into creative works and seeks to inspire others to explore their artistic soul and pursue creative journeys.

Her work combines the real-world experiences and molds them with a desire to express fantasy creatures and worlds through pattern, line and color. The wide variety of mediums allow her to explore which method would fit best for the emotion and story she wishes to convey.

Stoppel's artwork has been exhibited across the country and in Lacoste, France. She currently works for Exeter TV filming local artists and their personal art stories. She also creates animation and motion graphics for a variety of platforms. Education: BFA in Animation, double minor in Illustration and Sequential Art.

McManus will be displaying works in oil which explore "Outdoors Indoors: Bringing NH Inside". The NH outdoors is uniquely easy to love. 50 years of exploration and walking hayfields, beaches, and spongy forest floors make up this body of work. The adventure of painting outdoors connects McManus not only to the flora and fauna, but to the early settlers who persevered through weather, bugs, boulders and tree roots to find the heart of this place. White pines and hidden ponds are captured in snippets to bring home.

McManus cut her artist's teeth in MA and NYC where she learned she could grow the life she wanted back in NH. Parsons School of Design taught her how to maximize the pluck that country girls are born with. She welcomes looky-loos who approach while painting outdoors.

image to begin with, a photo the painter then interprets, or a painting the photographer recreates or interprets.
The pairs are hung together for the show. This show is being repeated yet again due to popular demand
and is quite interesting and powerful, bridging a gap between artistic mediums.

Show of Flowers Drop off: June 30 Reception: July 6 Pick up: July 28 For this show we will all garner our inspiration from another artist – Mother Nature. If you've ever taken a really close look at flowers you will see the beautiful intricacies of nature and science perfected. Be it a field of wild flowers, exotic blossoms in a vase, or humble posies from a backyard patch, your challenge is to showcase the beauty of flowers.

Along the Coast Drop off: July 28 Reception: Aug. 3 Pick up: Sept. 1 What's more alluring than the New England coast, especially in the summer? The rugged, rocky coast, rough surf, salty marshes, beach goers and explorers, lobsters and fishermen have lured artists to the shore for all of time. So many intriguing subjects the challenge may be narrowing down your list for this one.

Push yourselves out of your comfort zones and try something new for any or all of these themed challenges. Take on a new subject, or an old one in a new way. It's all about the creative process and having FUN!!! Theme shows are open to members and non-members. All work must be framed in a professional manner complete with a wire hanger, sized up to 16"x20" INCLUDING FRAME, and properly labeled on the back with artist, title, medium, and price. We recommend frames of brown, black, gold, or silver. Fee for SAA members: \$10.00 per piece up to two pieces, non-members: \$20.00 per piece up to two pieces. Pieces 16"x20" up to 22"x26" INCLUDING FRAME will count as two for \$20.00/\$40.00. Receptions will be held the first Fridays of the month from 4 - 7.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE:

In July, 2017, the Scholarship committee (Doris Rice, Gwen Morgan, Eunice Miller, Brooke Sinclair, Karen DesRoches, Darlene Zahn, Lisa McManus and Gerry Bresnahan) discussed the new format of awarding scholarships to deserving area high school seniors who have plans to continue their education in the area of visual arts. Gwen Morgan presented statistics on all the schools that have been included in the scholarship award since 1991 with the number of submissions and the number of students who have won. Darlene Zahn provided the amounts of scholarship money awarded from this information. It was decided that out of 15 original schools, 9 were chosen for a possible \$500 scholarship for 2018. We are pleased to announce that 6 of those 9 schools have selected students that were worthy of the scholarships from our organization and that SAA is able to award each student \$750 to further their education in visual arts. **The winners are:**


