AUGUST/SEPTEMBER 2ND SUNDAY DEMOS:

August Artist Bob Goudreau: "Scratchboard Art," Sun, Aug. 12, 1:30-3:30pm. Scratchboard art, an uncommon art medium, involves scratching literally thousands of marks through a darker outer layer to reveal varying amounts of the white inner layer just below the board's surface. Each scratch produces a white mark representing light in the design. Finished scratchboard art pieces may be left black and white or the white marks can be painted with translucent inks, producing beautifully colored designs. Scratchboard Art is very detail oriented and requires patience and an eye for form, light, and shadow. Images from completed scratchboard pieces make fine art prints.

Scratchboard Artist Bob Goudreau, a resident of Rochester, was introduced to scratchboard art in the fall of 2001 through a non-credit course at the University of New Hampshire. Bob took an immediate liking to this art form because it combines drawing and painting while producing three-dimensional pictures. Bob's scratchboard images are featured in the scratchboard section of the book titled "Compendium of Drawing Techniques" by Donna Krizek; a piece titled "Christmastime" appears on a Rochester, NH commemorative plate as well as a wine bottle to promote the city; and his pieces have won awards at the Rochester Fair. Bob is an active member of the International Society of Scratchboard Artists (ISSA).

September Artist Revelle Taillon: "How to Create Greeting Cards and Giclées from Your Artwork," Sun, Sept. 9th, 2018, 1:30–3:30pm. Come to this informative talk to learn how to create greeting cards and quality giclées from your artwork or photographs. Revelle Taillon has been creating cards and giclée prints of her artwork for over 10 years, for selling in galleries and online. She also creates greeting cards for members of her family, from photos combined

with text. Various programs can be used to add text or adjust color, value, contrast, etc. like Photoshop and Lightroom. Online or local suppliers can produce quality art prints or cards for you. If you want to create them at home, learn about how to accomplish this task with a scanner, printer, and card stock. Get info on suppliers of glassine envelopes and envelopes. Revelle Taillon is a hanging member of the Seacoast Artist Association, and teaches art classes.

2015's introduction to the Mystery Kits has been so successful; we are continuing the tradition making it both a Scholarship Fundraiser, and a Theme Show. Kits and their instructions will be available for purchase beginning in the Spring. The theme will be disclosed with the kits. Don't be afraid, it's really fun!

Push yourselves out of your comfort zones and try something new for any or all of these themed challenges. Take on a new subject, or an old one in a new way. It's all about the creative process and having FUN!!! Theme shows are open to members and non-members. All work must be framed in a professional manner complete with a wire hanger, sized up to 16"x20" INCLUDING FRAME, and properly labeled on the back with artist, title, medium, and price. We recommend frames of brown, black, gold, or silver. Fee for SAA members: \$10.00 per piece up to two pieces, non-members: \$20.00 per piece up to two pieces. Pieces 16"x20" up to 22"x26" INCLUDING FRAME will count as two for \$20.00/\$40.00. Receptions will be held the first Fridays of the month from 4 – 7.

• Learn to Draw in Colored Pencil: starts Tues, Oct. 2, 2018, runs 8 weeks, 1pm ~ 3pm. This class is for students who want to learn to draw with colored pencils or just want a class to practice more and improve your skills. Explore various techniques creating fur and feathers, preserving highlights to create volume, building layers of color, mixing for dark rich colors, creating interesting backgrounds, new highlighting techniques. You will work from photos and improve your own personal technique and style. Learn to use watercolor color pencils for your backgrounds, and use Liquin for dissolving colored pencils. Come meet new friends and see samples of colored pencil artwork from around the globe.



• Intemediate Acrylic Painting Class: starts Tues, Oct. 2, 2018, runs 8 weeks, 10:30am to 12:30pm. This class is for anyone who has had a class in acrylics or learned the basics on their own. We will continue learning the next steps, add more detail, and explore tips and tricks in acrylic painting. Acrylic paints offer a wide variety of ways to apply paint and you will learn about different kinds of mediums.
