

I was lucky enough to have grown up with a very creative and artistic mother who, when she wasn't sewing, crafting or gardening, was an amazing pastel artist. She recognized my interest in art and taught me drawing techniques at the age of six. Sketching with pencil and charcoals were my earliest favorite pastime until high school photography classes changed my trajectory. Photography will always be a lifelong passion and many of my wool creations are derived from my photo images.

Why wool as a medium you ask? It came about quite by accident but it's the most satisfying and unique experience I have had with any medium so far. It combines "painting" and "sculpting" of dyed or natural wool fibers using wet and/or needle felting techniques. I hope you enjoy my work as much as I enjoy creating it!
