THEME SHOW CHALLENGES FOR 2020: TBD



May 2020 - Dreamscape



April Featured Artist, Dave Saums, presents an exhibition titled *"Light Over Light"* filled with images from New England Lighthouses to barns and evening view of Half Dome in Yosemite National Park.

Dave Saums has been exhibiting his fine art photography since 1991, beginning first with an entry in an international competition sponsored by the Nature Company. Long a member of the Andovers Artist Guild in Andover MA, Dave has also been a member of the Newburyport Art Association (NAA - Newburyport MA) and the Seacoast Artists Association since 2010. He also served on the board of directors for the NAA for three years and founded the finance committee for the NAA.

His black-and-white and color images have won numerous awards at a variety of juried artist shows and at the Topsfield Fair (Topsfield MA), and have hung in art galleries in Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, and California.

Beginning photography in high school, his grandfather and uncle owned a nationally-known commercial photographic business in Madison, Wisconsin, developing a range of films, still photographs, and filmstrips as training tools for the US Department of Agriculture and a number of state agencies.

Subjects for the SAA Featured Artist exhibit for April 2020, titled "Light for Light", are varied and primarily based on images shot on Kodachrome color transparency film, between 1986 and 2015.

May, our Featured Artist, Samantha Licciardi, presents an exhibition titled "Drawing with Lines" a zentangle inspired hand-drawn Mandala Series.

Samantha is a self-taught artist who as been developing this fine line intricate style for about six years and is still always learning. Her work is completely symmetrical and meant to be viewed from any angle.

"Mandala" is a Sanscrit word meaning "circle". Mandalas are symbols used in various cultures as a tool for meditation as well as a way to understand or represent the universe. It is believed that by "entering" a mandala and proceeding towards its center you are guided through the cosmic process of transforming the universe from a place of suffering to a place of joy and happiness.

Originally from Haverhill, MA, Samantha now lives in Nottingham, NH but her works can be found all over New England. Samantha creates her mandalas from the center and works her way out, she describes the process as meditative. Her designs are easy to get lost in the small details. 


