

PRESIDENT/GALLERY MANAGER'S MESSAGE:

Our gallery is open once again! And, looking quite good with a complete changeover of exhibiting members' pieces, a new **Theme Show** and two new **Body of Work Exhibits!** What a great feeling it is to be back! The first month back open has been a success by all measures.

The Board of Directors has resumed (masked) face-to-face meetings and many of our members have been vaccinated for Covid-19. The Scholarship Committee is busy finalizing awards and planning fund raising activities. We are taking preliminary steps, anticipating that we can hold the **Members' Awards Show** this fall. We have come through what we hope was the worst of the pandemic in a good position to carefully and progressively resume operations. Due to the current high level of Covid cases: masks, physical separation, and a limit on the number of people in the gallery are still in place. THEME SHOW CHALLENGES FOR 2021:

Theme shows are open to members and non-members alike. All work must be framed in a professional manner complete with a wire hanger, and properly labeled on the back with artist, title, medium, and price. For a more consistent appearance on the wall, we recommend frames of brown, black, gold, or silver.

All judged shows take into consideration many different factors when awarding **Best in Show**. These factors include, but are not limited to: originality, technique in the specific medium of the piece, presentation, subject matter, design, relevance to the stated theme and whether the piece is an original piece of art. Keep in mind that, for non-photography entries, reproductions such as giclée prints, prints that are not numbered (and are not hand pulled) and other reproductions are not considered for **Best in Show**. However, all art hanging in the show is eligible for the **People's Choice** award.

Fee for SAA members: \$10.00 per piece up to two pieces, **non-members:** \$20.00 per piece up to two pieces. Pieces 16"x20" up to 22"x26" INCLUDING FRAME will count as two for \$20.00/\$40.00. You may enter one oversize and one 16X20 or smaller. See our website at **seacoastartist.org** for updates.

LORRAINE J. MAKHOUL - MAY 2021 BODY OF WORK: "DEFINITION IN WATERCOLORS"

Lorraine Makhoul whas been drawing and painting since she was a little girl. She has taken a number of "how to" classes but is mostly self-taught by studying instructional books on watercolors, colored pencils, and pastels. Her painting "Fishing Shanty I" was awarded "1st Place in Watercolors", "The Mary Alice Arakelian Foundation Award for work in Watercolor", in the Newburyport Art Association 2018 Fall Members Juried Show.

Lorraine likes definition in her paintings; thus the title "Definition in Watercolors." "My watercolors are unique in that they are not 'loose' and 'unstructured' like typical paintings. I like detail, color and definition; it just feels right to me. I think I choose a subject to paint when I see something in life that inspires me." As an amateur photographer, Lorraine has a wide variety of photographs to choose from when she wants to begin a painting. "If I don't have a reference photo, I just go out and take one. I painted my 'Leopard Cub' after visiting the zoo... the cubs were just so cute, I had to paint one. I'm thinking of doing another painting of the two cubs together that I photographed. JIM RYAN - MAY 2021 BODY OF WORK: "UNEXPECTED VISITORS"

Jim Ryan Known for his oil paintings of birds of prey, some of which now grace the walls of the new Center for Wildlife facility in York, Maine, Jim Ryan now turns his talent to songbirds. In his new series, "Unexpected Visitors", Jim has placed birds seen in his yard into still lifes he designed in his studio. He calls this "a whimsical venture into realism." These are on panels, 11 by 14 inches. Jim started painting only a few years ago and is mainly self-taught. He works in oils, but also uses watercolors, colored pencils, charcoal, graphite, and also enjoys working en plein air.

"The first time I picked up a paintbrush was an attempt to impress (SAA) artist Sonja Jacobsen whom I was dating at the time. (Editor's note: Sonja will have a Body of Work show at the SAA in September!) Because she was an artist, I took some painting lessons, but it quickly went from an attempt to impress, to a serious love affair with art. I didn't have the time to take more lessons, but I set up a studio in my dining room and picked up a brush as often as I could. My style is still developing, so I'm still not sure how to classify my art. I guess most would call it contemporary realism. It's exciting to see it change and develop, and I try not to force it or listen to others tell me where I should go. The artists that have influenced me include Robert Bateman, Andrew Thicshler, David Cheifetz, and John James Audubon." http://jimryanart.net/about/

JANICE LEAHY - JUNE 2021 BODY OF WORK: "BOLD"

Janice Leahy "I like edgy art," declares Janice Leahy when she talks about her show entitled "Bold". "I'm attracted to bold colors, working with profiles or abandoned buildings; interior and exterior. There is something that makes one look deeper at those images. I consider this my darker contemporary phase!"

Janice has been drawing and painting since she was a child, taking group lessons at the Tringale Studio of Art in Woburn, MA. She studied business in college (though she was accepted at two art schools; New England School of Art & Design and Montserrat College of Art). She took classes at the DeCordova Museum School in the early eighties. In 2008, Janice had a brain stem stroke caused by an aneurysm. "I had impairments to my entire right side (art hand). It took many months of physical therapy to overcome the various impairments. I couldn't draw a straight line and had to learn everything all over again. I evolved into a different artist. I switched mediums to acrylics. I am thankful for every day I breathe. I believe my works reflect that."

DAVE SAUMS - JUNE 2021 BODY OF WORK: PHOTOGRAPHS, "LIGHT FOR LIGHT"

Dave Saums Subjects for Dave Saums Body of Work exhibit, titled "Light for Light", are a selection of color and black and white images of New England lighthouses. Dave has been exhibiting his fine art photography since 1991, first with a winning entry in an international competition sponsored by the Nature Company. His black and white and color images have won numerous awards at a variety of juried artist shows and at the Topsfield Fair, Topsfield MA, and in Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, California, and Massachusetts art galleries.

Beginning photography at a young age, his grandfather and uncle owned a nationally-known commercial photographic business in Madison, Wisconsin, which likely spurred interest in photography both with his mother and with himself. Dave has had a life-long preference for black and white film photography. He also has been a lifelong railroad photographer and has been editor of the quarterly journal of a railroad historical society in Vermont. He is a member of the Center for Railroad Photography and Art (Madison, Wisconsin) and has attended sixteen of CRPA's annual conferences in Sacramento, Chicago, and Connecticut.

Dave is a member of the Seacoast Artists Association since 2010.
