

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Our fundraiser in support of World Central Kitchen's initiative to feed those displaced by the war in Ukraine was a great success! The total proceeds sent to WCK are more than \$13,000! The monies are from the sale of art donated by members and non-members as well as direct donations.

It all started when a group of members took off with an idea that originated with Debra Woodward. The result was a response from artists and the community the likes of which I have never seen! The board of directors and I extend our thanks to those of you who produced and donated their art! In addition, I want to thank Annick Bouvron Gromek who put in an exceptional amount of time to help make this drive a success. Exhibiting members were key in donating their art and recording the sales and donations in their role as gallery sitters. Seeing it all come together has been truly inspirational and most importantly will provide support for those in need!

The gallery is back to pre-pandemic operating hours, and programs that had been on hold are coming back online as well. Plans are proceeding to start having refreshments at future receptions (always with the possibility of some accommodations and restrictions that reflect the current state of COVID in the community at that time). Christine Blomquist is working on planning the **Members' Awards Show** in the Old Town Hall in November. **Second Sunday** talks and demonstrations are being discussed. The **Body of Work** exhibits coordinated by Debra Woodward has been enthusiastically received and are scheduled well into next year. We have two outside venues at present with the possibility of more in the future. Dave Turbide is looking into this and coordinating the **Exhibit at the Exeter Inn**, and Dave Saums is managing the exhibit at 100 Domain Drive. The **Scholarship Committee**, led by Maryclare Heffernan and Stephanie Williams, is in the process of identifying scholarship recipients and planning fundraisers.

You may also have noticed our increased footprint in print, online, targeted email and even broadcast media. Debra Woodward has been doing a great job producing content and getting us noticed. Kevin Talbot has kept our Facebook page up to date, and Dave Thompson has been doing the same with our webpage. Lynn Krumholz runs the email campaign and is also our membership leader.

It is a story of teamwork and focus and talented members that gives all of us a solid platform for exhibiting, selling and advancing the arts in our community.

I wish to thank everyone who made my tenure as President so rewarding! I am grateful for your support and very proud of what you have accomplished! We have come through a difficult time financially stable, with a beautiful gallery, an active and expanding scholarship program, and a talented and enthusiastic community of artists. After **Board Officer Elections in May**, I intend to spend more time pursuing my photography and conservation interests, while remaining as an Exhibiting Member and Board Member.

THEME SHOWS 2022:

Theme shows are open to members and non-members alike. All work must be framed in a professional manner complete with a wire hanger, and properly labeled on the back with artist, title, medium, and price. For a more consistent appearance on the wall, we recommend frames of brown, black, gold, or silver. All judged shows take into consideration many different factors when awarding **Best in Show**. These factors include, but are not limited to: originality, technique in the specific medium of the piece, presentation, subject matter, design, relevance to the stated theme and whether the piece is an original piece of art. Keep in mind that, for non-photography entries, reproductions such as giclée prints, prints that are not numbered (and are not hand pulled) and other reproductions are not considered for **Best in Show**. However, all art hanging in the show is eligible for the **People's Choice** award.

Fee for SAA members: \$10.00 per piece up to two pieces, non-members: \$20.00 per piece up to two pieces. Pieces OVER 16"x20" up to 22"x26" INCLUDING FRAME \$20.00/\$40.00. You may enter one oversize and one 16X20 or smaller.

Receptions will be held the second Fridays of the month from 5-7 pm.



INGER GREGORY - MAY 2022

"EXPLORING THE BEAUTY AND MYSTERY OF A SPIRITUAL PATH"

There is profound value in the process and enjoyment of the Arts. A former Art Educator, I believe that creativity and imaginative thinking should be supported in Education. The Arts are one of the best means to deepen understanding of diverse cultures, build empathy and respect for all people. JANICE OLENIO-MICHIENZI - MAY 2022 "OUIET PLACES PAINTINGS DRYADS: SPIRITS OF THE TREES"

In ancient tales of Greek mythology, it is believed that a peaceful nature spirit who lives in trees takes the form of a woman and is guardian spirit who guards the trees which they inhabit. The Greeks believe that the spirit of the trees can speak with animals who use the trees as their homes.

"After high school, I attended Northeastern University, Boston, to become a Radiologic/ Mammographic Technologist, married, had two children, and worked over 40 years. That left only a little time to devote to my creative side, but I always found time to paint or craft and give myself 'take me away' time to relax. Now retired, I am free to indulge in all my passions.

When I was 27, I took a class in Tole painting which piqued my interest. I paint in oils and acrylics and pastels. I love to bring serenity to my paintings and love to paint animals.

Painting is only one way I express myself with my God-given gift of creativity. I love crafting, and always have multiple projects going on. Gardening and garden design are also a passion, and I'm happy that it's seasonal so I can devote my time to creative expression whether with paints and brushes, paper crafts, embellished decoupage, fabric design, or working with seashells."
