How to Participate

Drop off and Pick up: Bring your work to the gallery before 3 pm on the drop off date for each exhibit. Please include your completed entry form. All work must be picked up on the pick-up date for the exhibit. *Theme shows are open to members and non-members alike.* **Fee for SAA members:** \$10.00 per piece up to two pieces, **non-members:** \$20.00 per piece up to two pieces. Pieces OVER 16"x20" up to 22"x26" INCLUDING FRAME \$20.00/\$40.00. You may enter one oversize and one 16"x20" or smaller. **Please note:** For the Nov/Dec show, art may be of any subject, but must be 11"x14" or smaller **including frame** and priced \$100 or less. Three small works, 5"x7" or less **including frame** may be combined as one submission. *SAA receives 25% commission on all sales.*

Presentation and Framing

We ask that work fits the theme for the month. It must be framed in a professional manner complete with a wire hanger, and properly labeled on the back with artist, title, medium, and price. For a more consistent appearance on the wall, we recommend frames of brown, black, gold, or silver.

SAA Receptions

Join us on the second Friday of each month as the SAA hosts opening receptions from 5-7pm. They are open to the public so all are welcome! It's the perfect time to meet many of the artists on exhibit and refreshments are always served.

Theme Show Awards

Many of our monthly theme shows offer **Best in Show** and **People's Choice Awards**! Different factors are considered when awarding Best in Show such as originality, expertise in a specific medium, presentation, subject matter, design, relevance to the stated theme and whether the piece is an original work of art. Keep in mind that for non-photography entries, reproductions such as giclée prints, prints that are not numbered (and are not hand pulled) and other reproductions are not considered for Best in Show. However, all art hanging in the show is eligible for the People's Choice Award. *The Best in Show winner will be awarded a free entry in the next Theme Show of the winner's choosing*!

Theme shows are open to members and non-members alike. All work must be framed in a professional manner complete with a wire hanger, sized up to **16"x20" INCLUDING FRAME**, and **properly labeled on the back with artist, title, medium, and price**. For a more consistent appearance on the wall, we recommend frames of brown, black, gold, or silver.

All judged shows take into consideration many different factors when awarding Best in Show. These factors include, but are not limited to: originality, technique in the specific medium of the piece, presentation, subject matter, design, relevance to the stated theme and whether the piece is an original piece of art. Keep in mind that, for non-photography entries, reproductions such as giclée prints, prints that are not numbered (and are not hand pulled) and other reproductions are not considered for Best in Show. However, all art hanging in the show is eligible for the People's Choice award. The Best in Show will be awarded a free entry in the next Theme Show of the winner choosing.

Fee for SAA members: \$10.00 per piece up to two pieces, non-members: \$20.00 per piece up to two pieces. Pieces OVER 16"x20" up to 22"x26" INCLUDING FRAME \$20.00/\$40.00, you may enter 2 pieces as long as only one is over size. See Nov/Dec show for change in specs.

2023 SAA Theme Show Descriptions

January: Winter Frost

Winter brings a special beauty with her fragile filigree of frost sketched on our bedroom windows each morning. Winter's art is everywhere in New England; on oak leaves, the skating pond, and every windshield. We are encased in a fleeting beauty that lasts until the sun or the heater spreads its warmth and this brief magic melts away. Share with us your winter wonder images of frost or fantasy, all fleeting and beautiful.

February: Let Me Show You What I Love

Do you remember when you first understood love? Do you remember your first love? Do you remember realizing that love is more than a stolen kiss, but a passion for beauty and a feeling of tenderness for people, places, and things? If you dare to share, we'd love to see what or whom you love. After all, sharing what we love is the sweetest gift of all.

March: Shadows and Light

If it wasn't for the shadows, we wouldn't have the light. Look around at the darkest darks and the lightest lights. The month of March offers gentle grey skies, shadows of the still bare tree branches, and dark earth emerging from a deep bright snow cover. The values of our vision live in every corner.
