# **BODY OF WORK SHOW SEPT./OCT. 2024:**

# ZOË BROOKE - SEPTEMBER: "WHIMSY, WOOL, AND WONDER"

A few months ago, my husband and I welcomed our son, and soon after I set to work at decorating his nursery. What I found through that process is that traditional nursery art is rather boring. Generic, similar takes on themes, none of which I found compelling. Thus, this series was born – an eclectic collection with just the right balance of whimsy & wonder. My aim was to create art that would inspire the imagination and call upon knowledge of classic fables, while offering textural elements for a multi-sensory art experience.

I am primarily an acrylic artist, but after having my son the ability to while away the hours in my studio became nearly nonexistent. Suddenly, I had a random 20 minutes to work on my art instead of the 3-4 hour blocks I was used to. So, my adjustment came with a shift in medium – from brushes and paints to needles and wool. Felting has allowed me to pick up and put down my pieces throughout the day as time allows, without worry of lengthy set-up or clean-up. It also brings with it a textural element that my baby adores, allowing him to be a part of the process.

# ANITA FREEMAN - SEPTEMBER: "PLAYING WITH COLOR"

Painting pictures has always been about capturing an experience. My paintings often have been about places I have been. Back in the studio, my memories of the day and the place flood back and become the energy that fuels the paint on the canvas.

What drew me to paint in later years was the practical reality that I now had the time to devote to something I had always wanted to do. Every child is an artist and I was too. Late in my career, after my children were grown, I was fortunate to find an excellent art teacher, Lully Schwartz in Amesbury MA. I studied with her for about 5 years. Her patient encouragement launched me into a world of color and movement with oil paints. I also did some watercolor but oils were so luscious and vibrant that I have stayed with them.

Sometimes the landscapes appear on canvas just as I see them. Lately, not only what I see, but what I hear, and smell and touch is coming through. My paintings seem to be more colorful and less detailed. So the new works are different, a bit sassy.

# KATHY STATIRES - OCTOBER: "LAND, SEA, AND (PLEIN) AIR"

Painting along the Seacoast has always inspired me. My husband and family have been boating along the coastline of New England for many years. Capturing those memories in paint is very gratifying. Plein air painting is my chosen form of art. Going outside to paint inspires me to capture the moment of the day. Once outside, I plan my composition by sketching thumbnail drawings in my sketchbook. After deciding on an illustration to paint I then draw onto my canvas using a charcoal pencil. Capturing light and values correctly takes a long time, so I often complete my oil paintings at home in my studio.

A lifelong resident of New Hampshire, living in Bedford, my career began as an art teacher. I taught grades K-12 for many years. Now retired, I pursue my talents by painting daily. I studied at Notre Dame College in Manchester, before receiving Masters Degrees at both Massachusetts College of Art in Boston and Rhode Island School of Design.

#### SARAH OPPENHEIMER - OCTOBER: "GHOSTS IN THE GALLERY"

Sarah Oppenheimer works with a variety of media: drawing, painting, printmaking, and photographic surprises. She likes telling stories in her art. In this show you will see oil and watercolor paintings of ghosts at play, the second pull from monotypes, which are called ghost prints, as well as botanical ghosts - summer's flowers past, leaves and scenes of fall touched by frost. These ghosts will not harm you. They are part of the natural passage to the colder time. Maybe they will stir up a memory or story in you.

Sarah Powell Oppenheimer is an artist from Kingston, New Hampshire who grew up in a house with a ghost. She's been drawing, painting and making things her entire life. Mediums include watercolor, oil, gouache, graphite, pen and ink, glitter, paper creations, charcoal, pastel, printmaking and photography. Early in the year she completed illustrating a children's book, "A Walk in the Woods with Izzy and Minnie", written by Muriel Ingells. Sarah also had a recent watercolor painting juried into a show at the Barn Gallery in Ogunquit.

Revelle Taillon Class: Drawing the Human Head: Ears, Eyes, Nose, Mouth, Hair at SAA Gallery

Have you wondered where you go wrong when you attempt to draw a face or a portrait? We will start with the basic skull, and work our way up to the planes of the face, while also learning proportions. Then add the skin, practice types of shading that affects highlights and shadows. Then each part of the face: eyes, nose, lips, ears, and hair. Anyone can learn to draw the human head with the tools I will teach you. Class starts: Monday October 7, 2024 and runs 8 weeks from 12:30 pm to 2:30 pm. Fee is \$180.00. No refunds.
