

Elizabeth Dudley - September — This New England Life

Elizabeth Dudley is an artist who chases the elusive beauty of our New England country days: from our homes to the seas. She focuses on a moment of immersion and works to portray that feeling on canvas. She hopes that when you see her paintings you will recall those moments.

Her love of painting began as a child in Connecticut living with beloved prints of the impressionists and Chinese art and museum going. Her role as an active artist began with still life work and portraiture. Over the years she has studied landscape painting with Tom Glover, Stan Moeller, Todd Bonita, Alastair Dacey and other local artists.

Today she lives in Newmarket, NH and participates with other artists on site in many plein air experiences. She is available for commissioned portraits of people, houses and animals working from life or photo reference.

In her home studio she has painted many portraits of people with developmental disabilities as a volunteer for Friends in Action, Portsmouth. Each year she donates paintings to select school and Public Television fundraisers. Elizabeth is a member of New Hampshire Artist Association and Seacoast Artist Association.

Carey Jane Connor - September — Moments of Blue

I've always been amazed with classical realism. The grace and color harmony of the Renaissance was a major influence, and is obvious in my early painting days.

I hope to immerse the viewer in the often overlooked details, which was my discovery as an oceanside kid in Newburyport. My aim is to draw the viewer in with details, prompting an appreciation of beauty and form. Sea and sky demand the use of blues often in my works.

My soul is drawn to the sea, ever-changing clouds of the day and lately, intricacies of daily plant life. At times I use meticulous techniques to capture nature's nuances in light and drama through layering. Now that my kids are grown, I'm able to paint daily and explore the rewards of playing with color and light using more contemporary expressions. This is shown in my more recent pastel paintings.

Carey Jane is a Best in Show Award Winner - "Through Eyes of a Child" at the Seacoast Art Association. Her art is featured at the Pastel Society of NH, The York, Maine Art Assoc., A Pleasant Shoppe, Portsmouth and at CareyJaneArt.com

Wendy Welton - October — Monhegan Journal

I paint what I love. Sometimes that's something I see, and sometimes that morphs into something else particularly if I let it sit in my mind for a while, and eat my vegetables. I love a good moody day - a little fog, a little storm coming, and (of course) golden hour and magic hour (dawn and dusk). I love how color and texture in paint make me feel. I love painting en plein air (outdoors, on location) - it focuses my mind and connects me to the source. Those paintings often lead to other paintings.

My goal is to reduce the image to its essence. I typically use pretty big chip brushes, but mostly everything but brushes - palette knives, putty knives, silicone bowl scrapers, squeegees, rubber rollers - whatever I can get my hands on that will make the mark or texture I want. I really enjoy pushing paint around until it feels like the story I'm trying to tell.

Art is my third career. The first was restaurant management, which I was really bad at. The second was architecture, which I was really good at. I'm now full time art, and starting to hit my stride. I started painting in 2016, and have studied primarily via weeklong workshops with some top notch artists.

Greg Moschetti - October — The Tonalist Landscape

I came to painting relatively late in life and found significant joy in the creative process and its outcomes. I feel that the role of the artist is to capture the spiritual nature of the landscape and elicit the same spiritual sense in the viewer. This is not a new notion. George Inness and the tonalist painters of the late 19th century clearly painted in

Few of my paintings are of actual places. Rather, they are studio creations based on atmospheric landscapes remembered or imagined. They often have a sense of familiarity about them and, when successful, draw the viewer into a spiritual feeling of peaceful solitude. These often involve landscapes and nearby water with sky reflections and distant horizon views. Many are at the day's beginning or end and at season's change.

I paint exclusively with oils on canvas, sometimes using photo references as a prompt. My typical process is to start painting and let the imagery emerge. Primarily self-taught, I've studied with Dennis Sheehan, America's foremost living tonalist painter. I hope these paintings evoke the spiritual connection to landscape in you that I find in making them.
