How to Participate

Submission: Email your submission by Thursday prior to the drop off date to themeshowsubmissions@seacoastartist.org. Please Include: TITLE, MEDIUM, PRICE, ARTIST NAME, and PHONE NUMBER.

Drop off and Pick up: Bring your work to the gallery before 2 pm on the drop off date for each exhibit. Please include your completed entry form (forms are located at the gallery and on our website seacoastartist.org). All work must be picked up on the pick up date for the exhibit. *Theme Shows are open to members and non-members alike.*



Fee for SAA members: \$10.00 per piece up to two pieces, **non-members:** \$20.00 per piece up to two pieces. Pieces OVER 16"x20" up to 22"x26" INCLUDING FRAME \$20.00/\$40.00. You may enter one oversize and one 16"x20" or smaller. **Please note:** For the Nov/Dec show, artwork must be priced at \$150 and under and sized 12"x12" or smaller framed. Artist may submit two entries 12"x12" or smaller, one entry can consist of 3 smaller works 5"x7" or smaller framed at the same price. *SAA receives 25% commission on all sales*.

Presentation and Framing

We ask that work fits the theme for the month. It must be framed in a professional manner complete with a wire hanger, and properly labeled on the back with artist, title, medium, and price. For a more consistent appearance on the wall, we recommend frames of brown, black, gold, or silver. Theme Show Awards

Many of our monthly theme shows offer **Best in Show** and **People's Choice Awards!** Different factors are considered when awarding Best in Show such as originality, expertise in a specific medium, presentation, subject matter, design, relevance to the stated theme and whether the piece is an original work of art. Keep in mind that for non-photography entries, reproductions such as giclée prints, prints that are not numbered (and are not hand pulled) and other reproductions are not considered for Best in Show. However, all art hanging in the show is eligible for the People's Choice Award. *The Best in Show winner will be awarded a free entry in the next Theme Show of the winner's choosing!*

Seacoast Artist Association 2026 Theme Show Descriptions

January: Winterscapes Black & White

"Black and white is not a lesser color image - it is, in many ways, more powerful. It gets to the core of what is important in an image, leaving behind the distractions of color." - David Präkel. This theme uses black and white pho-



tography or artwork to evoke the cold, serene beauty of winter images. Feel free to use your own definition of "winter".

February: Beyond the Surface Mixed Media

"Creativity takes courage." - Henri Matisse. Mixed media art is all about pushing boundaries and stepping into the unknown. Whether you're layering paint over collage elements, experimenting with textures, or trying unconventional color palettes, creativity demands courage. Explore layers in your mixed media piece and enjoy a deeper engagement with your art.

March: Whispers of Color Abstract Creations

"A painting to me is primarily a verb, not a noun, an event first and only secondarily an image." - Elaine de Kooning. Abstract art is more than layers of paint - it's a story told through hues, textures, and light. Whether you see an ocean, a storm, or simply a dance of colors, whispers of color remind you that beauty often lies beneath the surface.

April: I Can Haiku, Can You? Celebrating Poetry Month

You probably remember from high school English class that a haiku is a form of Japanese poetry. It follows a simple 5/7/5 pattern of syllables, so there are a total of three short lines. In honor of Poetry Month, we'd like you to write or find a haiku and create to it or make a piece of art and write a haiku to describe it! It does not have to rhyme and it does not have to make sense to anyone but you! We will post your haiku with your work.

May: En Plein Air In the Open Air



"Everything that is painted directly and on the spot always has strength, a power, and a vivacity of touch one cannot recover in the studio... Three strokes of the brush in front of nature are worth more than two

days of work at the easel." - Eugène Boudin. Bring us what you have been working on as the weather warms or even something you created last year!

June: In Bloom, Flowers

"I must have flowers, always, and always." - Claude Monet. Because these fragile master-pieces of nature evoke such profound emotion, they have provided infinite inspirations for artists for centuries.

July: Coastal Canvas The Natural Beauty of the Seacoast



"At the beach - time you enjoyed wasting, is not wasted." - T. S. Eliot. We are lucky to live amidst the nature that surrounds us here on the Seacoast. What is your favorite place or favorite wildlife?

August: Beyond the Postcard Local Color

"Art is the only way to run away without leaving home." - Twyla Tharp. Stay local and show your neighbors and our tourists what we love about our home. There is enough to paint here to last a lifetime.

September: Nocturne Evening or Nighttime

"I often think that the night is more alive and more richly colored than the day." - Vincent Van Gogh. Van Gogh relied more so on emo-

tion than observation. Instead of blacks and grays, he used a patchwork of vibrant blues and yellows. Show us a composition inspired by, or evocative of, the night.



October: Faces & Figures

"You would hardly believe how difficult it is to place a figure alone on a canvas, and to concentrate all the interest on this single and unique figure and still keep it living and real." - Edouard Manet. We invite you to submit your art and photography depicting the human form - both faces & figures.

November/December: Small Art, Big Ideas

Show us the beauty and skill of your smallscale creations, by showcasing how smaller works can hold immense depth and meaning.

Artwork is priced at \$150 and under, and size is no larger than 12"x12" framed. Artist may submit two entries under 12"x12",



one entry can consist of 3 smaller works under 5"x7" framed at the same price.
