Dave Saums - November — *Surroundings*

Good days come and go, as do days when we are sad or suffering unwanted challenges. Art surrounds us in many different ways and help the healing process: visually, through music, and when we look around at what the world offers. An exhibit titled "Surroundings" is a small way to demonstrate simple images from natural surroundings, beauty in small things, beauty in structures that once served a practical purpose, but that we admire today for the setting and architecture, even if the original function is lost.

The value of art is seeing and thinking and expressing in many different ways and forms. Photography is only one. The photographer's "palette" is made up of the same critical features as a watercolorist or oil painter: light, direction, shadows and highlights, color or lack of color, focus, and some emotive feature that attracts and holds our eye.

I have been photographing seriously for most of my life and exhibiting in New York and New England in galleries, art associations, individual exhibits, even a California inn, for thirty years. I have presented about aspects of photography as art and historical topics illustrated with photographs.

Maggie Ginieres - November — *New England Moments*

Making art calls me back to the intense investment of Self in the wonderful tasks of child's play. With Crayolas and newsprint one could escape a very confusing adult world. Frost called poetry a "momentary stay against confusion." At least for me, making paintings produces the same effect. Momentarily I return to where crayoned masterpieces muffled the booming world of schedules, evening news and uncertainties. That's why I paint.

My method is just to keep going with it. If LIFE gets in the way, the pursuit waits; it never dies. One class with a great teacher can bring you to a new place in your grasp of materials. Times change and my stockpile of supplies has grown to colored pencil work and alcohol for underpainting in pastel and stunning yarns for felting. My purpose (and my joy) is in learning new ways to create that "stay against confusion." When viewers find spaces in my work to rest for a moment, to admire bits of color or the weave in a nest, I am happy. It's really as simple as that. Have fun!

Janet LaBrecque - December — Holiday Hopes

From an early age, I was drawn to the joy of drawing and painting. After completing my college education, I brought creativity into the classroom throughout my teaching career. Once I retired and raised my two sons, I was finally able to dedicate myself fully to watercolor painting—a journey that continues to inspire and fulfill me.

I have studied with artists Doris Rice, Judi Wagner, and Jan Kilburn, and participated in watercolor workshops in France, Italy, Monhegan Island, and Cape Cod. While living in Naples, Florida, I painted regularly with the plein air painters of the Naples Art Association, experiences that deepened both my technique and my love for painting outdoors.

My work is fueled by a desire to bring color, energy, and a sense of vibrancy to the subjects I paint. I hope my watercolors spark a sense of delight and excitement for the viewer, just as creating them does for me.

Maureen Carey - December – Dejà vu

'Until you make the unconscious conscious it will direct your life and you will call it fate". Carl Jung I think I have always been making art in one form or another. My high school art teacher was the one responsible for directing and teaching me to work in various mediums. Mostly charcoal and pastels during those years. In my 20's and 30's I branched out into oils with various teachers at UNH and privately. I was the artist to many pet portraits during that time. In my late 30's my focus was primarily on the "art" of making a living.

Now in my third act or "last hurrah" as the saying goes, I still love oils. I love the smell, the texture and the forgiveness that oils provide, but have ventured into watercolor - a (quick drying) but masochistic medium. I am on a continuing evolving path of accumulating experience and then starting over.

On October 4th we held a **Y'Art Sale** in front of the gallery on a glorious fall day. Y'Art is new and gently used art materials. A big "Thank you" goes out to members and friends for bringing your Y' Art for us to sell. Look for details about this reoccurring event next year.

Currently we are featuring a **Holiday Ornament Sale** in the gallery from **Nov 1–Jan 2, 2026**. Choose your ornaments from the cute tree in the gallery. We are asking the membership to create handmade ornaments no larger than 3 inches. Please drop off by the beginning of December or earlier. All proceeds will go to the scholarship fund.

This winter we're launching **Art Makes a Difference: Panel by Panel**, a new fundraiser supporting our Scholarship Fund. We'll hand out 80 birch panels (5"x7") for artists to create in any medium during January and February. Finished, signed panels are due by the end of March, displayed in April, and sold for **\$50 each on April 11**, with all proceeds to scholarships. Artwork will also appear in a video and on our website and social media.

In addition to fundraising, the committee gets area High Schools applications for art student Scholarships.
